PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Last month's piece recommending we all trial new growing media before wholly changing to the new raised some interest, so I thought members might be interested in a small trial I ran with some

phalaenopsis seedlings ex community pot. You may recall I mentioned that I had been growing Phalaenopsis successfully in a perlite, foam and Lithuanian peat moss mix (PFP). The trial was to compare a medium of straight 8-12 mm coconut fibre chunks to a medium comprising a mix of 75% 8-12 mm coconut fibre chunks and 25% PFP. The 20 or so plants were in 70 to 80 mm pots side by side in a single tray. After several months there was a marked difference in the two groups of plants. Those in straight coconut fibre produced very long (for the size of the plant) root systems, running all over the bottom of the tray, but have comparatively little leaf growth. They look to be doing it a bit tough. By contrast those in the mix with PFP have average root growth but much better leaf growth and look to be thriving. It would be easy to leap to the conclusion that a medium of straight coconut fibre chunks is unsatisfactory. One could postulate reasons such as lack of fines not allowing retention of one or more nutrients in solution or cations not bonding to the surface of the fibre. There is of course another explanation. It could be simply that the mixture with PFP is more suited to my other plant management practices. If I changed one of them perhaps the result would be different. The point is that the growing medium is but one of the factors to be considered.

Registrars Report

Change to award centers...Ian advised members that the only meeting where plants will be considered for awards without notice is now this meeting (OSNSW) and all other judging for awards will be organized by the Registrar or his representative at the request of individuals/societies. This will enable the Registrar to circulate Award Judgings throughout the metropolitan area. Ian was pleased to report the elevation of 4 Associate Judges in the Hunter/Mid Nth Coast region to the position of Judge. They are: Ian Nelson, Phil Radford, Daryl Jones and Ernest Baldwin. Congratulations to you all.

Ian advised that there had been 3 awards for the last month, all owned by Garrie and Lesley Bromley:

Ian and Geoff then presented award certificates to previously successful members.

Treasurers Report:

In response to an email from an affiliated society enquiring about the actual financial situation of OSNSW, Ralph wrote that: "The society remains solid. For example we have \$150,000 on deposit with the Commonwealth Bank, in addition to averaging \$17-\$18,000 in the bank. Over the last 2 years we have enjoyed a fantastic interest rate of an average 7.2% on our investments. We have just experienced on a roll over of one parcel of \$75,000, a drop to 4.5%. The next parcels fall due in April 09 and July 09 and I am expecting a further decline to say 3 or 3.5%. On our present rate of expenditure this would turn a surplus into a loss, but you would not see the full effect in the accounts until 2009/2010. The purpose of announcing this, firstly to the Committee for them to consider what steps could be undertaken to cut costs if possible, and/or new sources of income as an offset, and secondly to the members to keep them apprised of the situation facing the society. I suspect most other societies face the same reality. The worst situation is that we would make a moderate loss next year, however we are fortunate in having a back up reserve of at least \$150,000 in solid investments with the Commonwealth Bank." Geoff added to Ralph's report by advising members that our half yearly earnings are less than those for the same period in 2008. However we had a couple of quite large expenditures, Society badges and Taxation advice, which accounted for some of the difference.

Guest Speaker

Welcome to Dennis Diehm of Dendi Orchids who warned us that he was going to talk this evening about SEX.... and indeed he did, he gave a really interesting talk on Phally breeding. The selection of parents, your 'vision' for the outcome of progeny and the reality. (is not always what you hoped for!)
