Irene extended a warm welcome to the new committee and then declared the formal business completed. The Annual General Meeting was declared closed at 8.30pm.



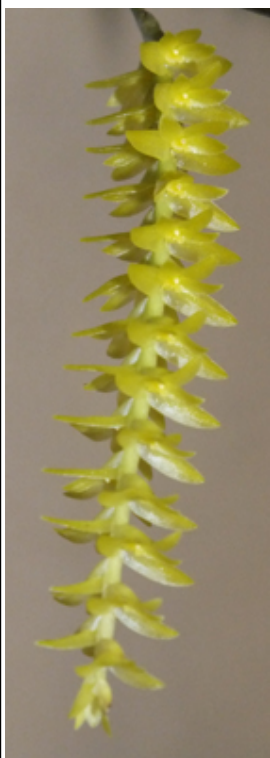

Dendrochilum javieri

For some period of time this species was known as *Dendrochilum javieriense*. Being the case then the specific epithet (last name) would indicate that this species name is representative of the area from where the orchid was originally found! And indeed within the islands of the Philippines there is located on the Island of Leyte, an area known as the Municipality of Javier. So it is easy to see how this could all be misconstrued! In fact this species is named after Mr Elias Javier a nurseryman from the Philippines. Being named after an individual the specific epithet is then *javieri*. Now I'm guessing there may be a couple of Doubting Thomas's out there that may in fact say, "What makes you so sure of this???" Good question I say!!! The answer is quite simply. The Municipality of Javier is on the Island of Leyte. Our orchid is only found in the mountains of the Provinces of Nueva Ecija and Nueva Vizcaya which are centrally located on the Island of Luzon and not on Leyte! Apart from this Jim Cootes confirms this, as he is a friend of the nurseryman in question! And I for one am not going to question Jim's knowledge! Certainly Jim needs to be commended for the continuing work that he does to champion the orchids of the Philippines!

The species was first described in 1989, only a relatively short time ago in the big scheme of things, by Lawrence Magrath, Glenn Bulmer and Ingrid Shafer in the publication *Lindleyana*! The type forms location is in Nueva Vizcaya on the Dalton Pass. Here it is found at elevations between 1830 and 2440 metres altitude growing on moss covered tree branches, and in a fair amount of direct sunlight. I grow mine in the cold glass house in a bark mix, the more light the plant receives has the benefit of turning the emerging foliage a wonderful bronzy colour (however be careful as this can be overdone). This colour combined with the intense gold colouring of the blooms makes for a wonderful sight!

There are a number of *Dendrochilum* species readily available now days, with most of the orchid fairs having plenty available, and with some studious buying, purchases can be made at reasonable prices, and with very few needing any more protection than a cold glass house. This genus is easily one of the hardiest and most rewarding to grow, well suited to our climate and the perfect genus for anyone venturing into a foray of species orchids for the first time.

Angraecum sesquipedale

ORIGIN: Angraecum is a genus of about 200 species that are from the tropical regions of Africa, Madagascar and surrounding tropical islands, and Sri Lanka. Angraecum sesquipedale is primarily from Madagascar and grows in the warmer, tropical, lowland forests of this mini continent.

SPECIAL INTEREST: In 1850, in Madagascar, Charles Darwin discovered an orchid with white and waxy petals, Angraecum sesquipedale, with a 16-inch spur. At the base of this tube is a sweet liquid. Darwin surmised that this nectar was clearly destined for the orchid's pollinator and maintained that there must be an insect in the Madagascan forest with a 16-inch proboscis, and in addition, it must be nocturnal because the Angraecum is fragrant only at night. Fifty years later after Darwin suffered much ridicule, such an insect was discovered--Xanthopan morgani predicta (hawk moth). It has a strange coil on the front of its head. Attracted by the smell, the moth is drawn to the orchid and the strange coil is unfurled to a length of precisely

LIGHT REQUIREMENTS: This is an easy plant to grow on a windowsill or under lights. It needs some shade and should not be subjected to any direct sun. An east or west window with a sheer curtain is ideal. Provide adequate ventilation.

TEMPERATURE: They should be grown in intermediate conditions with day temperatures in the 70-80 F range and nights between 60-68 F. They will appreciate a short cool period after flowering, but no definite rest period.

MOISTURE / HUMIDITY: Provide 60% humidity and keep the medium evenly moist. Water freely in the summer and less often in cooler periods, especially after flowering.

FERTILISING: Feed with weak 1/4 strength balanced fertiliser weekly during the summer. Decrease feeding frequency after growth matures.

POTTING MEDIUM: These plants do well grown in baskets or pots of bark or sphagnum moss. Use plastic pots with adequate drainage holes. Repot in the spring.

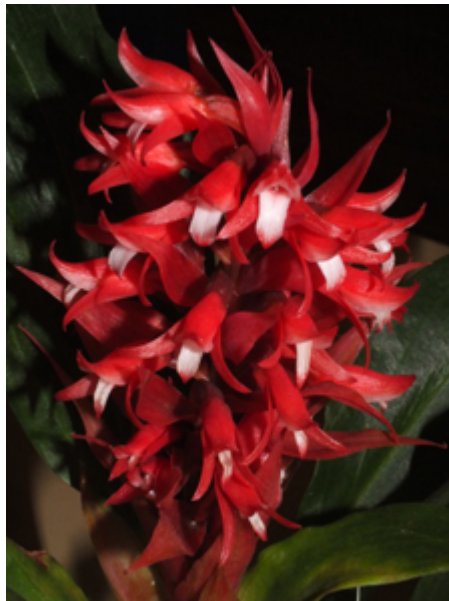

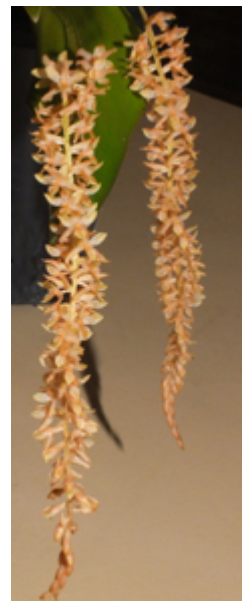
