DISPLAY JUDGING 100 POINTS

PRESENTATION - 25 POINTS

Visibility of plants without crowding. Pleasing arrangement of colour. Placement of outstanding plants.

DESIGN AND APPEARANCE OF DISPLAY - 25 POINTS

Originality, visual impact and interest, proportion and line, Display should have open space sufficient to allow judges to access the good plants.

FINISH AND TICKETING - 10 POINTS

QUALITY OF ORCHIDS - 30 POINTS

Assess the overall quality of the flowers in the display, particularly plants which enhance the display. To be assessed in relation to the total number of plants in the display.

VARIETY OF COLOUR - 10 POINTS

RULES AND CONDITIONS

Initial results are tentative until all results are collated and finalised the following day.

- 1) All entries are free and open to Members of the O.S.N.S.W. and Affiliated Societies.
- 2) Entries are received upon the basis that the Society or its sponsors shall not be responsible for any loss, destruction nor damage to such exhibits and the exhibitor shall have no claim against the Society or Sponsors.
- 3) Entries are accepted on condition that they are disease free. The decision of the Show Marshal shall be final.
- 4) All competitive entries shall have been owned and in the possession of the exhibitor for the preceding six months. This rule does not apply to Ferns or Foliage Plants used in the displays.
- 5) There shall be no restriction to the number of entries by an exhibitor in any class. Entries in joint names will be accepted.
- 6) The Show Marshal and Committee reserves the right to reject, remove or rearrange any exhibit without giving any reason for that action and to reclassify any plant if necessary, prior to judging.
- 7) Exhibitors may use Ferns and/or Foliage plants to embellish exhibits. Such plants are not considered in judging except for their decorative effect in displays. No flower or fruit other than Orchids or Anthurium may be used in any display.
- 8) Nominations for classes as marked # must be in the hands of the Show Marshal by before you leave the area on Wednesday 18th June 2008.
- 9) All plants shall be booked in and in position ready for judging by lights out (approximately 10.00 pm) on Wednesday 18th June 2008. All equipment must be inside barriers and out of walkways between 9.00am and 5.30 pm.
- 10) If in the opinion of the Judges no exhibit in any class warrants a prize, none will be made. At the discretion of the Show Marshal additional classes may be included where warranted.
- 11) Judging shall be by a panel of Judges nominated by the O.S.N.S.W. Registrar and shall be in accordance with the standards and by-laws laid down by the O.S.N.S.W. Inc. **THE JUDGES DECISION SHALL BE FINAL.**
- 12) No exhibit may be dismantled or removed prior to closing time of the show at 4.00 pm on Sunday 22nd June 2008.
- 13) **PRIZES WILL BE HANDED TO SOCIETY SECRETARIES FOR PRESENTATION AT SOCIETY MEETINGS.**
- 14) 'NOVICE' shall mean: Any exhibitor until she/he has won in aggregate first prize in any three genera or classes at any Orchid show or shows, 'MISCELLANEOUS' or similar phrase shall count as one Genus/Class. The winning of the yearly point score in a monthly competition of any Society in any Genus/Class shall be deemed equivalent to a first prize in that Genus/Class. An exhibitor shall remain a Novice until the end of the calendar year in which the first prize for the third Genus/Glass was won.

- 15) 'SEEDLING' shall mean the complete plant grown from seed and flowered for the first time. For exhibition purposes seedlings shall retain their status of 'Seedling' throughout the flowering season in which they first flower.
- 16) 'MINIATURE SPECIES' are defined as Orchids with flowers 15mm or under in size across the widest part of the flower and distance between the first and last flower 200mm, regardless of the number of flowers or. All 'Miniature' species are to be judged in this class.
- 17) 'LAELIINAE ALLIANCE' classes shall include all combinations and not only those hybrids with Cattleya in their parentage.
- 18) 'CATTLEYA' means Cattleya or Hybrids between Cattleya and one or more of Brassavola, Laelia and Sophronitis.
- 19) Staking shall be in accordance with the rules of O.S.N.S.W. i.e. flowers may be supported in the best possible manner for presentation. This supporting should be in such a manner so as not to be obtrusive and distract from the overall beauty and charm of the plant. With single flowered genera e.g. Paphiopedilum, Lycaste, etc., ties or support shall be no higher than immediately below the ovary. If it is necessary to tie above the bottom flower or top branch, the judges are permitted to penalise, or temporarily remove such tie for the purpose of judging.
- 20) When displays are being judged for arrangement and display, recognition will be given to displays which are uncluttered and spaced to best advantage. As a guide, approximately 25% of the floor area should be open to allow access to judges. Also displays should be dressed all round so as to present an aesthetic appearance.
- 21) All grooming aids & supports other than staking as per Condition 19, must be removed from all plants before being benched. Failure to remove these will automatically disqualify the plant from being judged
- 22) Champion seedling is not to be considered for Grand or Reserve Champion unless it has already won the Champion in its class.
- 23) A sales table of members' plants will be conducted. Well established, pest and disease free plants may be submitted for sale. The Society reserves the right to reject plants without giving any reason. The Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to plants submitted for sale. The Society will deduct a 20% commission on all plants sold. Plants for sale must be invoiced on the approved form in duplicate. One tie tag per plant is to be used to indicate price and owners selling code. The sales manager will determine the number of plants accepted at any one time.
- 24) The Schedule is based on the orchid names that we are all used to and do not take into account the name changes resulting from the DNA research.

NOTES:

Bill Murdoch Trophy Nomination

The Champion and any awarded Australian native hybrids are eligible for nomination for the Bill Murdoch Trophy.

Members wishing to enter for this trophy must provide their own photographs and pay the nomination fee.

Ira Butler Trophy Nomination

The Champion and any awarded Australian native species are eligible for nomination for the Ira Butler Trophy.

Members wishing to enter for this trophy must provide their own photographs and pay the nomination fee.

Herman Slade Trophies

The Champion and awarded Australasian species or hybrids other than Australian Natives are eligible for nomination for the Herman Slade Trophies.

Members wishing to enter for this trophy must provide their own photographs and pay the nomination fee.
